Sonja Ellison taught political science at Georgetown, American and Gonzaga Universities before moving to Albuquerque. Since the 2004 recount effort she has become a central figure in election reform in NM.

Lowell Finley is one of the few attorneys in the nation with experience litigating electronic voting issues, having successfully sued Diebold Election Systems, Inc. in a California qui tam action.

Kim Kirkpatrick, Las Vegas, retired math and computer science professor at NM Highlands University, serves on the steering committee of Verified Voters of NM and has participated in several public discussions of security issues raised by the use of voting machines.

Pat Leahan, is the founder of the Las Vegas Peace and Justice Center in Las Vegas, NM; and teaches part-time at NM Highlands University. She is a founding member of Verified Voting NM and works closely with United Voters of New Mexico.

State Senator Jerry Ortiz y Pino was instrumental in the passing of the 2005 Election Reform Bill, which provides a voter verifiable paper trail and automatic audit. He currently serves on the Election Reform Task Force.
