Bill McCamley Has Strong Lead in NM-2 Primary Leads Teague by Nearly Two to One

With just over two months left before the Democratic primary election for New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District, Doña Ana County Commissioner Bill McCamley holds a nearly two to one advantage over former Lea County Commissioner Harry Teague in a head-to-head matchup. McCamley's lead over Teague stands at a commanding 43 – 22 percent, before any information about either candidate is introduced.

McCamley leads Teague in every demographic group, including Hispanics and Anglos, men and women, and across most of the district. He leads Teague by more than 50 points in Doña Ana County and is tied with him in the eastern part of the district, where Teague lives.

There are still many voters who are undecided in this district, but there is no doubt that McCamley begins the contest in the driver's seat and is in a strong position to win the primary election in June.

These findings are based on a survey of 403 likely Democratic primary voters conducted March 17-19, 2008. The survey is subject to a margin of error of + 4.9 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level.
